We have one more block to do our best in school this year. Please help to ensure your student is in school every day possible to help them finish the academic year well.


Osprey Wild Junior Class Trip -April 10-12

The VES School Board passed an "Away for the Day" cell phone policy for grades 6-12. This goes into effect on **<u>April 8, 2024.</u>**


- Students may not use a cell phone or have a phone out from 8:30 - 3:05 except during lunch.
- Cellular phones and other personal electronic devices shall be either:
 - Left at home, turned off and placed in a secure location, turned in to the office/admin before 8:30 am, or turned in to the student's advisor before 8:30 am
